This includes but is not limited to surveys, qualitative inquiries, laboratory studies, intervention trials and program evaluation data. Priority will be given to research studies involving original data collection that is complete. Selected posters will be displayed throughout the conference, with presenters available during the designated poster hour. Research conducted by authors from all levels of the profession is welcomed, and student submissions are strongly encouraged.

Any questions regarding poster submissions can also be directed to Dr. Chronister. Authors will be informed via e-mail by December 21, 2015, with instructions for poster preparation.

- Abstract – 500 words detailing the study purpose, research questions and hypotheses, study sample, design and analyses, results, and implications summary. Given the short turn around, data collection and analyses do not need to be completed at the time of submission. However all data must be collected and analyzed by January 30, 2016.
