

2016 AAPA Dissertation Research Grant

We welcome proposals for the 2016 AAPA Dissertation Research Grant. These grants, each up to \$500, are awarded to doctoral students to support research that contributes to the advancement of Asian American Psychology. AWARD: Doctoral students may apply for a grant up to \$500, for a one-year period.

PROPOSALS: Proposals should be concise, no more than 5 double-spaced pages, excluding bibliography and instruments, and should include the following sections:

- Abstract (one page or less, separate from the body of the proposal)
- Problem or topic/Rationale
- Brief overview of Theoretical/Conceptual Framework
- Research design, including research questions, instruments and measures to be used, subject selection, data collection and analysis.
- Anticipated results
- Implications for Asian American Psychology
- Budget plan

SUPPORTING DOCUMENTS:

- Curriculum Vita
- Recommendation letter from the sponsor/chair or advisor of the research project.

SUBMISSION: Submit one digital copy of the proposal (including supporting documents) to the to the Awards Committee Chair (One comprehensive Word or PDF file please), Hyung Chol (Brandon) Yoo, Ph.D. at yoo@asu.edu. Please put the name of the applicant and "AAPA Dissertation Grant" in the subject line of the email.

DEADLINE: ALL MATERIALS MUST BE SUBMITTED BY April 1, 2016, by 5pm EST.

Winners will be announced at the annual AAPA Awards Banquet. Winners will present their research at the following AAPA annual convention.

The grant winner MUST submit a final report summarizing the results to the AAPA Executive Committee within 12 months of receipt of the grant.
